


 FIREFLIES	4-5 YEAR OLDS	The Firefly class is led by a professional educator (with a parent co-op assistant) who facilitates readiness for Kindergarten with specific goals related to the following skill sets: social, self-help, spiritual, fine and gross motor, problem solving and language. Some examples from the academic skill sets include: letter and number recognition and formation, pre-reading/reading activities, hands-on activities that promote early math and science skills, and interaction with literature through discussions and projects. This class includes hands-on art, science, cooking and social studies projects as well as picture studies (lessons in learning to observe and appreciate art) taught by our art educator, and music classes taught by our music educator.  GRASSHOPPERS	3.5-4 YEAR OLDS	The Grasshopper class is led by a professional educator (with a parent co-op assistant) who facilitates readiness for Kindergarten by encouraging learning through hands-on, teacher directed exploration and play. Grasshoppers work with manipulatives as an introduction to math concepts, engage with literature, explore natural science (such as things that creep and crawl!), gain confidence through art ("Look what I made!"), and engage in pre-reading activities and number/letter recognition and formation- just to name a few! This class includes picture studies (lessons in learning to observe and appreciate art) taught by our art educator, and music classes taught by our music educator.  JUNEBUGS	3-3.5 YEAR OLDS	The Junebug class is led by a professional educator (with one parent co-op assistant). Through both play based learning and direct teaching times students will be encouraged to use what they already know about numbers, colors, shapes, etc. as a springboard for gaining increased mastery as well as acquisition of new skills. Some topics to be covered include days of the week, months of the year, community helpers, letter recognition and number concepts. This class includes a regular art component (which seeks to build a child's confidence in creating visual art) as well as picture studies (lessons in learning to observe and appreciate art) taught by our art educator, and music classes taught by our music educator.  CATERPILLARS	2.5-3 YEAR OLDS	The Caterpillar class is led by a dedicated teacher (with one parent co-op assistant). As this is many students' first classroom experience, the Caterpillar curriculum includes instruction toward mastery of new environments, both at school and in the community. Along with exposure to typical preschool topics (shapes, colors, counting, animals, seasons, holidays, community helpers, etc.) Caterpillars cover topics of interest such as "Being a Good Friend", "A New Baby at Home", and "Going to the Doctor" through literature, art, music and directed play. This class includes a daily art component that seeks to build a child's confidence with various mediums (paint, stamping, glue, etc.). Caterpillars meet two mornings a week, 9:00am-12:45pm.  HONEYBEES	2.5-3 YEAR OLDS	Honeybees is led by a dedicated teacher (with one parent co-op assistant). The intimate class size of eight children allows for consistency and lots of one on one time with the teacher, two things that will help make your child's experience away from home a success! Honeybees learn through direct teaching times, covering topics such as shapes, colors, counting, animals, seasons, holidays, community helpers, etc., as well as hands-on activities that encourage cognitive and social skills. The class includes a daily art component that seeks to build your child's confidence with various mediums (paints, stamping, glue, etc.). Honeybees meet one morning a week, 9:00am-12:45pm.
